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Our mission

Horizon House, in partnership with individuals with disabilities and their families, advocates and provides comprehensive, community-based rehabilitation services.

We create opportunities for those served to manage their lives through environments that emphasize individual strength and choice.

Founded in 1952, Horizon House is a psychiatric rehabilitation agency with roots in the Quaker tradition. At Horizon House, we assist people with psychiatric disabilities and/or substance abuse problems, developmental disabilities, and those who are homeless to learn to live and work in the community.

Programs include treatment, services, resource coordination, housing education and employment training and support and are located throughout Southeastern Pennsylvania and the state of Delaware.

Horizon House provides social, vocational, educational, residential and employment opportunities without regard to race, color, sex, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, age, or disability.

Individuals served by ICCM are connected to a seamless system of support to help them become as independent and self-sufficient as possible. Working in partnership with team members, they learn how to take responsibility for managing their lives, restore individual goals and increase their personal happiness, success and satisfaction.

With the support of the team, individuals also gain access to a wide range of resources in the community to further improve their everyday lives.

ICCM provides services with a recovery-oriented approach that encourages and fosters participant empowerment and choice. Special emphasis placed on education, employment, and the skills and resources for living independently in the community.

Services Provided

The ICCM team provides comprehensive treatment, rehabilitation, and support services as a self-contained unit. These include:

- Service/Resource Coordination
- Crisis Assessment and Intervention
- Symptom Assessment and Management
- Individual Supportive Therapy
- Medication management
- Co-occurring mental health and substance use services

- Peer supports
- Education and employment-related services
- Activities of daily living skills training
- Social and interpersonal relationships
- Leisure time skill training
- Supports and consultation services for families.

Admission Criteria

- Be a Philadelphia resident, 18 years of age or older.
- Have severe and persistent mental illness (e.g. schizophrenia, major mood disorder).
- Consumer has had difficulty
 - utilizing traditional MH Services Medically
- Have had difficulty utilizing traditional mental health services in the past.
- Have a history of psychiatric hospitalizations:
 - 3 or more acute psychiatric inpatient hospitalizations. OR
 - 30 days or more in an acute psychiatric unit or state hospital within the past 12 months OR
 - 3 or more contacts with crisis intervention/emergency services within the past 6 months

Referral Information

ICCM is funded by Community Behavioral Health (CBH) or Department of Behavioral Health (DBH).

The funding source must be approved for all services in advance before a referral can be made.

Referral packets are required to be generated by base service units (BSU's), case management unit, hospital, input units, or other services provided.

Private insurance is not accepted.

Staffing

Staff Members work with individuals in the community or in the office Monday through Friday 8 AM until 8 PM. On weekends and holidays, staff are scheduled eight hours per day based on need.

Staff support is also available by telephone 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Each multidisciplinary team includes a Director, Psychiatrist, Nurses, Mental Health Professionals and Specialists, Drug and Alcohol Professionals, Employment Specialists and Peer Support Specialists.
