BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

Brittany has been a part of the Horizon House Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) team since 2023. During this time, she has improved both her physical and mental health while avoiding hospitalization.

When she first started Horizon House's ACT program, Brittany was what she would call "unproductive." She would spend her days at home with little to fill her calendar. Brittany and the ACT team decided this was the perfect point to begin her journey to recovery.

After joining Horizon House's ACT program, the idea of finding a job was discussed with Brittany. She was hesitant at first, but the trust she built with staff gave her the confidence she needed to start her job hunt. ACT Staff worked to prepare Brittany for an interview at a cafe, where she is still employed.

"Without the Horizon House team, I'm not sure I'd be at my job or in this position," Brittany said. "They push me and encourage me. I'm very thankful for that."

Brittany has also had a longtime love of music. Noticing this, the ACT staff helped her find the resources needed to reignite her musical passion. She completed a series of auditions after applying to Moravian University's music program and was accepted! Brittany will soon complete the program and then plans to enroll in the Master's Program to achieve her ultimate goal of becoming a music therapist.

Her talents are vast. She can play several musical instruments and sing quite a tune, even in Italian. Music has always played an inspirational role in Brittany's life. She would like to apply her knowledge, talent and the joy she finds in music to help others, just as music has helped her.

"I know I can do it," she said. "I want to achieve that goal and help others find joy in the things they love."

HOMELESS SERVICES

Catherine has lived most of her adult life within Horizon House programs and under the guidance of our dedicated staff.

In desperate need of support and a change in her life, Catherine found the Shelter Plus Care program over 15 years ago. This program serves formerly homeless individuals who are in recovery from substance abuse issues. Catherine has worked diligently to improve herself and achieve the stability in her life she yearned for.

"I knew I needed something, someone, somewhere," Catherine said. "Something had to change. Horizon House, the staff and the programs, finding them was really the turning point."

She is now over 20 years sober. With the Shelter Plus Care team's encouragement, Catherine has learned how to drive, graduated from high school, gotten married and even purchased a new home.

While all those accomplishments are incredible and deserve to be applauded, Catherine feels that giving back to the communities that have supported her over the years and being a positive influence are just as important. She remains active in Narcotics Anonymous programs, often serving as a sponsor for new members. Catherine makes herself available as a mentor to those who live with similar issues to the ones she has conquered and is always willing to listen or lend a helping hand.

"I'm a story of success and I want others to be, too." She said. "I've been there. I want to give back and show that anything is possible."

A self-motivated champion, Catherine is the embodiment of Horizon House's mission and a true example of perseverance and success.

For example, during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, Matthew showed up for all his scheduled shifts, proving that he is resolute and committed to carrying out his responsibilities.

"I want to be trusted and show I really care about my job," he said. "It's a good feeling for me."

What makes Matthew's story especially inspiring is the spirit with which he faces each day. With the support of his team, he has worked hard to strengthen his communication and customer service skills, proving that with the right environment, we can all grow and succeed.
